## **Melting Iceland**

Glaciers cover over 10 percent of Iceland's surface. Studies show that between the years 2000 and 2019, Iceland lost around 750 square kilometers (290 square miles) or seven percent of the glacier surface. (Almost the size of a small country)

Iceland's glaciers steadily shrank from 1995 to 2010, losing an average of 11 gigatons of ice per year. Starting in 2011, however, the speed of Iceland's melting slowed, resulting in about half as much ice loss, or about 5 gigatons annually.

(Iceland is a very successful case for sustainability)


